Tuesday, May 19<sup>th</sup> – Read James 4 and complete the corresponding worksheet.

Wednesday, May 20<sup>th</sup> – Read James 5 and complete the corresponding worksheet.

Thursday, May 21<sup>st</sup> – In James chapter one, the original text uses the word “perfect” 7 times. When this word is translated from the Greek, it means wholeness. In the N.K.J.V., it says, “But let patience have its perfect work, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing.” Write me one paragraph on what this means to you when you think of the word *perfect* as *wholeness*.

Friday, May 22<sup>nd</sup> – In chapter one, James says, “Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds...” Write one paragraph on how you can change negative to positive and find pure joy throughout the trial of Covid19.

Tuesday, May 26<sup>th</sup> – At the end of chapter one, James speaks about true religion and keeping oneself spotless from the world. Write one paragraph on what you think this means.

Wednesday, May 27<sup>th</sup> – In chapter two, James talks about the “royal law of scripture.” write me a paragraph on what the royal law is, and how you can demonstrate it even throughout this time in history.

Thursday, May 28<sup>th</sup> – James 3 talks about taming the tongue. Write one paragraph on how this chapter might help you to think before you speak.

Friday, May 29<sup>th</sup> – James 4 tells us to submit to God. List three ways you can submit to God.

Tuesday, June 2<sup>nd</sup> – Read 1 Kings Chapter 17.

Wednesday, June 3<sup>rd</sup> – Read 1 Kings Chapter 18. After reading about Elijah, why do you think James used him as an example in his letter? Write me one paragraph explaining your answer.

Thursday, June 4<sup>th</sup> – What is one lesson you learned in the book of James that will help you moving forward in your relationship with Christ and others. Write me a paragraph explaining your answer.

Thursday, June 4<sup>th</sup> – Last assignment!!! Write our Bible class theme scripture and tell me what this verse means to you now, compared to at the beginning of the year.
