Your tuition rate for the 2026-2027 school year is: _____ for _____ months.

We no longer issue tuition coupon books, but we have some. If you would like one, please request it. The first payment is considered the August payment and is due Aug. 20th, and **must be paid no later than Aug. 25th** to be able to start school on August 26th.

Tuition is due the 20th of each month. The grace period lasts until midnight of the last day of the month. After that time, a \$20 late fee is automatically assessed.

⇒ ⇒ **REMEMBER -- The enrollment fee (which, if not paid by now, has two \$25 late fees invoiced), the first month's tuition, and any tuition and fees still owed from 2025/2026 **MUST BE PAID BEFORE** the first day of school, August 26th, for child/ren to attend.**

SCHEDULING TIMES FOR STUDENTS IN GRADES 7 THROUGH 12

All students in grades 7 through 12 should either come to the Academy (high school, room 1) during one of the following scheduling times or call Mr. Todd Rosio at (724) 274-0322 **during these hours:**

Monday, August 10th between 10:00 p.m. and 2:00 p.m.

Tuesday, August 11th between 1:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m.

Wednesday, August 12th between 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m.

If it is not possible for you to schedule during these times, please call the office **before 2:00 on August 12th**. Otherwise, your schedule will be prepared without your input.

7th & 8th grade note: Since there are not as many electives available to 7th and 8th graders, scheduling by phone might be more practical than coming in person.

KINDERGARTEN ORIENTATION ON MONDAY, AUGUST 17TH

The Meet and Greet for kindergartners and their parents is scheduled for Monday, August 17th from 5:00-6:00 p.m. This is a time for the kindergarten students and parents to meet each other and the kindergarten teacher in the kindergarten room. A separate meeting for parents only will be held on August 20th, as noted below.

K-6TH GRADE ORIENTATION MEETINGS ON THURSDAY, AUGUST 20TH

Only parents of kindergarten through 6th graders are to report to the Academy for the individual classroom orientations on August 20th, unless the 1st-6th grade student is a new enrollee to the Academy. **Only 1st through 6th newly-enrolled students may attend with their parent(s).**

So that parents having children in more than one grade may attend more than one orientation, we have staggered the meeting times. All elementary meetings will be in their classrooms. These are important, informational meetings. At least one parent from each family should attend.

Open Teaching Positions – Ministry Opportunities

We are presently in need of one elementary teacher (we are currently interviewing prospects), one high school part-time language teacher, high school elective teachers, substitute teachers, and a high school flag football coach.

FLAG FOOTBALL

Per the above, we are asking for a volunteer flag football coach. Any boys in 7th-12th grade interested in playing flag football this fall should call the school office to get his name on the list. If flag football happens, practices would be after school once a week once school starts. The permission slip including fee info is listed on the school website under DOWNLOADS. The permission slip would be due at the first practice.

Secondary (grades 7-12) Dress Code

Dress code – All clothing is to be modest, neat, and God-honoring. (See 1Tim. 2:9 and 1Peter 3:3-4.) Clothing that is see-through, too tight, too low/wide at the neckline, sleeveless, has split-shoulder sleeves or is too short is not permitted unless worn with a shirt over or under. Absolutely no SKIN or UNDERWEAR is to show between tops and pants. Dresses, inc. slits in skirts, should come to the top of the kneecap. Shorts, **PJ pants, tight stretch pants** (i.e. yoga) are **not permitted in gr. 7-12**; girls are permitted to wear below-the-knee capris. All clothing must be clean with no holes and **clothing and any tattoos may not have inappropriate writing or graphics (skulls, etc.)**. No hats, head coverings (hoodies must be worn with **HOODS DOWN**), or wide or costume headbands. **Except earrings, no body piercing jewelry is permitted**. No non-traditional hair color, hair styles, or distracting makeup is permitted. **Boys - pants must be worn at waist**. Boys - no makeup. **Three dress code violations in one 9-wk. gr. period equals a Sat. ISS****. Final judgments will be made by the Principal.

EITC Program - YOU can help us!

The state government has a program called the EITC scholarship program, where businesses can contribute to a scholarship program instead of paying corporate taxes to the PA government in Harrisburg. The basic idea of this program is that a business would contribute money to a scholarship program instead of paying certain types of Pennsylvania tax. The business must be set up as a corporation (not a single proprietor or partnership) to pay the right type(s) of tax. The business then receives a **90% tax credit**, up to the full amount of their Pennsylvania taxes. If the business contributed \$1000, the business would receive a \$900 credit on its Pennsylvania tax. At an actual cost to the business of \$100, a scholarship of \$1000 could be created to help a low-income family send a child to our school.
